I recently received the sad news from his son Phil, that one of our first members and branch supporters, Michael Curme, passed away after a long fight with Parkinson's Disease. Michael was a longtime supporter of the WFA and attended local meetings for as long as he was able to do so.

Michael left several items pertaining to the Great War asking that they should be sold with all proceeds going to the Langley House Trust whose mission is "to work with those who are at risk of offending or have offended, establishing positive foundations so that they can lead crime-free lives and become contributors to society. This means safer communities, fewer victims and restored lives". Michael was a prison visitor and a strong supporter of the charity.

The Battle of Jutland was the culmination of the Dreadnought Arms Race and was the only encounter in which the war could have been lost in a single engagement.

The battle was fought to a messy conclusion on the afternoon of 31 May 1916.

7379 Sapper Charles Spencer Jones 4th Siege Company, Royal Monmouthshire Royal Engineers

Charles Spencer Jones was born in 1888 in Cardiff but came to live at Steam Mills near Cinderford in about 1894. He worked with his father Thomas as iron founders at Teague and Chew, Heywood Engine Works, Steam Mills, an engineering company that specialised in the manufacture of water pumps and steam equipment.

He attested to the Royal Monmouthshire Royal Engineers on 14 December 1914 and was posted to the 4th Siege Company. He declared that he had previous militia service having served five years with the 1st Monmouthshire Rifle Volunteer Company.



He landed in France on 19 May 1915 and was killed in action in Flanders on 31 March 1916, aged 28 years.



He was buried at Voormezele Enclosures No 1 and 2, near Ypres and is remembered locally

on the War Memorial in Holy Trinity Church, Drybrook.
